We know: - There are 7 continents and 5 oceans in the world. - There are similarities and differences around the world. - Beacon Fell is a hill nearby.	- Know that Keswick is in the north-west region of England. - Know that Keswick is north of Preston. - Know that Keswick has mountains and lakes. - Know that v-shaped valleys are created by rivers and erosions. - Know the key features of v-shaped valleys. - Understand how food chains work and how we as people impact on the environment in this way. - Know that Paro is a mountain region in Bhutan and that there are both similarities and differences between Paro and Keswick.
Key Vocabulary: Learn the meaning of the word/phrase	
mountain - land that is taller than 600 metres high is called a mountain, so a mountain is taller & steeper than a hill.	valley - a long ditch, in the land. It usually lies between hills or mountains. Most valleys are formed by rivers or streams that erode, or wear down, soil and rocks.
stream - surface water that flows through the land. Streams are smaller than rivers.	landscape - the land that we can see. We can see hills, mountains, rivers and streams, so all these things may be part of the landscape.
vegetation – plant life or total plant cover	urban – a place where people live and work together in close proximity
