

Jana

Jana is a world of wonders and dangers: a colourful and exciting place full of secrets.

Location

Jana is the lone planet orbiting Alpha Proxima (known to astronomers as Alpha Centauri C or ACC) approximately 4 light years from Earth.

Landscape

Although the upper atmosphere of Jana is toxic, hidden below is a world of wonder. Vast continents, covered in thick deciduous forests, are spaced out evenly across Jana's surface. Flowing freely between these continents are several large oceans of dark purple water. The oceans' waters reflect the purple hue of the potassium-filled toxic clouds above.

Life

Life on Jana is varied and well adapted to the harsh conditions of this hostile planet. Most forms of life are highly dependent on the brown-leafed trees of the vast forests. Climbing and scavenging are essential skills for all land animals (survival is difficult on Jana) and all creatures are octopods (eight-limbed). Because food is in scarce supply, most creatures have a number of natural predators. A key aspect of all animals is their ability to camouflage themselves and merge into their surroundings.

Did You Know?

For many years astronomers believed life in the Alpha Centauri system was not possible. Jana is named after the god of secrets because life on the planet was a secret for so long.
