

Noun Phrases

Expanded noun phrases add more detail to the noun and make description more vivid for the reader.

The noun is call the **head** of the noun phrase because the phrase built around the noun.

Words can be added before the head **premodifier** (pre = before, and modify = change) and/or after the head **postmodifier** (post = after, and modify = change).
