

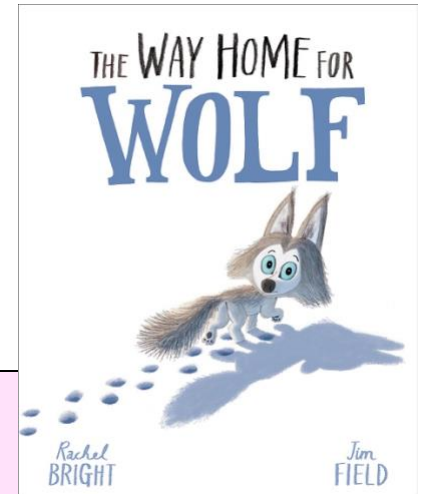

Key Skills in reading

- Listen, discuss and express views about a range of texts at a level beyond that at which they can read independently
- Orally retell a wider range of stories, fairy tales and traditional tales
- Identify, discuss and collect favourite words and phrases
- Introduce and discuss words within the context of the text, linking meanings to known vocabulary
- Activate prior knowledge and raise questions
- Develop understanding of what fiction and non-fiction texts by asking and answering questions
- Make inferences about characters and events using evidence from the text
- Make predictions on what has been read so far
- Make contributions to whole class and group discussions
- Listen and respond to contributions from others

Key Skills in writing

- Orally rehearse each sentence prior to writing
- Develop a positive attitude to writing
- Secure the use of full stops, capital letters, exclamation marks and question marks
- Say, write and punctuate simple and compound sentences using the joining words *and*, *but*, *so* and *or*
- Plan and discuss what to write about e.g. story mapping
- Use past tense for narrative
- Use specific text type features to write for a range of audiences and purposes
- Edit and improve own writing in relation to audience and purpose
- Proofread to check for errors in spelling, grammar and punctuation

Key Skills in reading

- Listen, discuss and express views about a range of texts at a level beyond that at which they can read independently
- Read a range of non-fiction texts which are structured in different ways, including information, explanations, instructions, recounts, reports
- Identify, discuss and collect favourite words and phrases
- Introduce and discuss words within the context of the text, linking meanings to known vocabulary
- Use morphology to work out the meaning of unfamiliar words
- Activate prior knowledge and raise questions
- Develop understanding of fiction and non-fiction texts by asking and answering questions
- Identify how specific information from non-fiction texts using the contents page, index, labelled diagrams and charts
- Participate in discussion about what is read to them, taking turns and listening to what others say

Key Skills in writing

- Secure the use of full stops, capital letters, exclamation marks and question marks
- Use commas to separate items in a list
- Say, write and punctuate simple and compound sentences using the joining words *and*, *but*, *so* and *or*
- Select, generate and effectively use adjectives
- Identify, generate and effectively use noun phrases
