Due to Covid-19 restrictions in 2020-2021, additional swimming lessons could not be provided for those children in Year 4- 6 who did not achieve the expected swimming levels. Two of the year six children, attended additional swimming lessons in Spring 2018 and Spring 2019 through the use of the Sports Funding budget.
