▶ Know that Keswick is in the north-west region of England. ▶ Know that Keswick is north of Preston. ▶ Know that Keswick has mountains and lakes. ▶ Know that v-shaped valleys are created by rivers and erosions. ▶ Know the key features of v-shaped valleys. ▶ Understand how food chains work and how we as people impact on the environment in this way. ▶ Know that Paro is a mountain region in Bhutan and that there are both similarities and differences between Paro and Keswick.					▶ Use compass directions to identify Keswick as being in the north-west region of England and located to the north of Preston. ▶ Make observation about features that give Keswick character e.g. lakes and mountains. ▶ Describe places and features using simple geographical vocabulary. ▶ Recognise how people can affect the environment. ▶ Describe similarities and differences between mountainous regions.
