Pupils should note that in French the days and months do not have a capital letter as they do in English. Also, in a date the word 'the' is not used nor is 'fourth/fifth' etc. English: Monday, the 3rd October French: lundi, trois octobre.	Numbers from 1-31 In French.	'I' in French often has a double 'ee' sound to the English ear. Therefore the days end with a double ee sound not an 'I' sound – Lundi = landee not loonday as most English people say it and so on with the other days and months.
