Places in a French town such as la poste, le musee, le college, le cinema, la patinoire, l'église, le marche, le supermarche etc. Directions: a gauche (left), a droite (right), allez tout droit (straight ahead), premiere (1st), deuxieme (2nd), troisieme (3rd).	- In Spring 1 and 2, pupils will exam the world of work and will be looking at the places people work in and what jobs they do. - They will also use directional language again in several of the topics.
