Year 5/6	Topic: The weather	Term: Spring 1
Prior Knowledge	Key Topic Vocabulary	Future learning
In this topic pupils are learning about the weather and where French people would eat, depending on the kind of weather they are experiencing. It would be ideal if pupils knew the weather types and had discussed them in other curriculum areas during Year 3 or 4. For consolidation of this work, they will revisit it now and, once again, in high school when it forms part of one of the key topics of free time and leisure which is obviously impacted by the weather.
